Midland was a junior academy until 99-00. They were an extension campus of Enterprise Academy in 97-98 and 98-99 and offered junior and senior classes but diplomas were issued from Enterprise Academy. They obtained K-12 accreditation and started issuing their own diplomas 99-00.

Minnetonka Christian Academy is a junior academy but offered junior and senior classes during 00-01, 01-02, 02-03, and 03-04 as an extension of Maplewood Academy. In 00-01, MWA issued four diplomas, in 01-02 three diplomas, 02-03 eleven diplomas, and in 03-04 sixteen diplomas for Minnetonka graduates. The above totals for MWA includes MCA graduates for these four years. MCA was a full secondary school from the 2004-2005 school year to the present.

In 2007-2008, Mile High Academy had seven 12th grade graduates from Vista Ridge Academy. In 2008-2009, MHA had five 12th grade graduates from VRA.
